## PRESENT PROGRESSIVE FOR FUTURE ARRANGEMENTS

Meaning	Form	Use
The present progressive is a verb tense which is used to talk about <b>future arrangements</b> . A <b>future arrangement</b> is a plan that you have decided and organized with another person.	 + am/is/are + ver <b>ing</b> + comp.  -Statement: You <b>are seeing</b> your friends <b>tomorrow</b> .  -Question: <b>Are you watching</b> TV <b>this afternoon?</b>  -Negative: You <b>are not having</b> a class <b>next week</b> .	Use 2:  Time expressions are often used when present continuous is used to talk about future arrangements.  1. I'm <b>working over the New Year</b> . 2. They <b>are flying</b> to New York <b>tomorrow morning</b> . 3. So what <b>are we all doing at Christmas?</b> 4. I'm <b>going</b> to bed <b>now</b> .

USE	FORM	MEANING
The simple past tense shows that you are talking about something that has already happened.	 + verb in past + complement  I went to the park yesterday	The past simple emphasizes that the action is finished. You can also use the simple past to talk about a past state of being, such as the way someone felt about something.
